#### #RedforEd movement continues

Thousands of CTA members and other public education allies took to the Capitol on May 22 to raise their voices against the for-profit charter schools that are siphoning funds from public schools and are failing our students. They witnessed a major victory with the passage of AB1505 which would ensure local communities control the authorization and renewal of charter schools and also repeal provisions allowing the State Board of Education to approve, renew or hear appeals of charter school petitions. It also allows local school boards to consider the economic, facilities and academic impacts of a charter school applicant on students in neighborhood public schools.
